(10) Academic Leadership, Management and Administration

In the School of Internet of Things, Entrepreneur College (Taicang), Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University (XJTLU), Suzhou, China:

- **Dean of the School (2022-2024)** - I was the founding Dean of the School, following the leadership of the previous Acting Dean of School. I was responsible for the strategic thinking, structuring of the School, leading the discipline construction, human resources management (Recruitment, PDR, and Promotions), budget planning, laboratory equipment renovation and creation of new laboratories as well as all aspects of teaching and research. When I left, the School was in its early stages counting 10 academic staff, 4 administration staff, 3 laboratory technicians and circa 150 students at undergraduate level. I led the complete revision and major changes to our BEng programme and also led the now submitted to UoL proposal for the School's first Master Programme. I also supported the reasonably successful PhD program. XJTLU is a joint venture university between two excellent and world renown Chinese and UK universities. During this period I had to use my understanding of Chinese and UK National cultures and Academic values to conjugate interpretation and execution of University regulations and policies. I also had to adapt in terms of leadership modes and style, communication skills, administrative methods and generally what is a very unique academic environment. I have communicated extensively with Vice-Presidents, Principles, Directors, Deans and Academics in this university and created an extensive understanding of issues, opportunities and problems facing international joint-venture universities in China.

In the School of Information Management of the Sun Yat-sen University, Guangzhou, China:

- **Dean of the School (2016-2019)** - I was responsible for discipline construction, strategic thinking, 13th 5 year plan, human resources management, budget planning, building maintenance and renovation, equipment, teaching and research. The School has more than 1200 students at undergraduate, masters, professional masters, PhD and postdoc, 35 members of academic staff and 12 members of administrative and CPC party staff and a varying number of research associates and research assistants. As part of my leadership, the School improved in all criteria of university evaluation as well as placed the School in a world rank for the first time ever in its history, namely 51 in the AWRU world ranking in 2020. During this period I developed an understanding of Chinese National and Academic culture, namely in terms of leadership modes and style, communication skills, ideological imperatives, administrative methods and generally what is known in China as "Chinese characteristics". I have communicated extensively with Deans and Academics in this discipline and created an extensive network of contact all over China.
- **Director of the VR+Culture Laboratory (2019-2020)** - I was founder of this virtual reality lab and invested 2 million RMB of my university seed fund on it. I was responsible for creative thinking, strategic development, research supervision, recruitment and administrative supervision of the lab. By the time I left, three distinct applications were developed on: VR Chinese Ancient Book, VR Museum and VR case study to support the assessed groupwork for an UG IS Analysis and Design module.

(12) Academic Teaching

In Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University (XJTLU):

- In the School of Internet of Things, I was exempt from teaching duties whilst at the Entrepreneur College (Taicang) whilst appointed as a Dean of the IoT School. Therefore, my learning and teaching main duties were to lead the curriculum review and design undergraduate and master's levels courses. At undergraduate level we redesigned the BEng in IoT by removing all generic Business School optional modules, adding electronic engineering foundation modules, a data science for IoT theme throughout the programme and optional modules on IoT application environments such as: IoT for Smart Cities, IoT for Smart Manufacturing, and IoT for Healthcare Practice and Environments. I also lead the development from scratch of a new MSc in Advanced IoT.
- In the School of Advanced Technologies, I lead a module on **Introduction to Emergent Technologies** and participated in the teaching of a university wide module on

In the School of Information Management of the Sun Yat-sen University:

- At the School of Information Management of the Sun Yat-sen University, and for 5 years (2016-2020), I have again contributed to the development of the Information Systems and Information Management undergraduate programme (BSc in IM&S) and developed 10 English language modules of which I taught 4 (**IS Analysis and Design, IS Project Management, IS Change Management and Knowledge Management**). This development was supported by two educational projects which also aimed at designing and constructing a teaching laboratory fully equipped with computers operating with full English versions of all the Operating System and SW necessary for the teaching.
- During this same period I also contributed and led the restructuring and remodelling of the PhD program, introducing core modules in Research taught in English and taken by all PhD students, of which I taught 2 (**Research Methodologies and Research Ethics**). The aim in this strategy was twofold, the teaching of research methods and the use of the English language in the context of research to facilitate publication in the future.
- During this period and building on the long experience gained in Sheffield, I successfully introduced and developed experiential learning, problem-based learning and inquiry-based approaches in the curriculum design of my undergraduate and postgraduate modules. Approached that are less common in China. I also developed a VR environment to support case-study supported problem-based learning in the IS Analysis and Design module.
- I also created, organised and taught on the 4 consecutive versions (2016 – 2019) of the “**International Summer School on Information Research Methodologies and Methods**”. This was a full English teaching environment that focused on basic research methodologies and representative information research topics, around which students carried out and practice research understandings and skills. For 10

days, students took part in theoretical sessions in the morning and practical sessions in the afternoon. During these practical sessions, students were requested to create research questions on the morning topics and produce research designs that challenged their research capacity. Both Chinese and International speakers from the US, Europe and Korea were invited to teach and work with the students.
